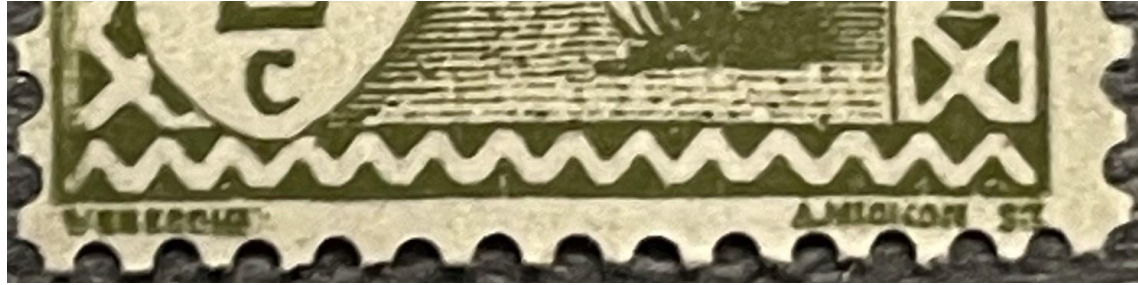
- Ruins of a Roman Coliseum in town of El Djem

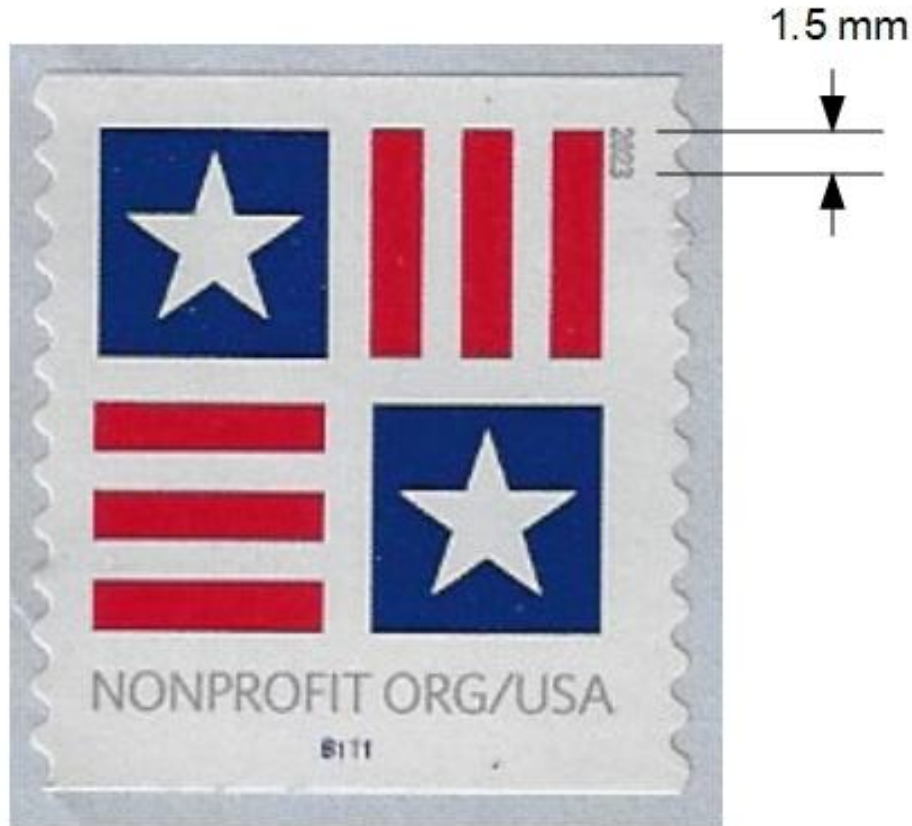

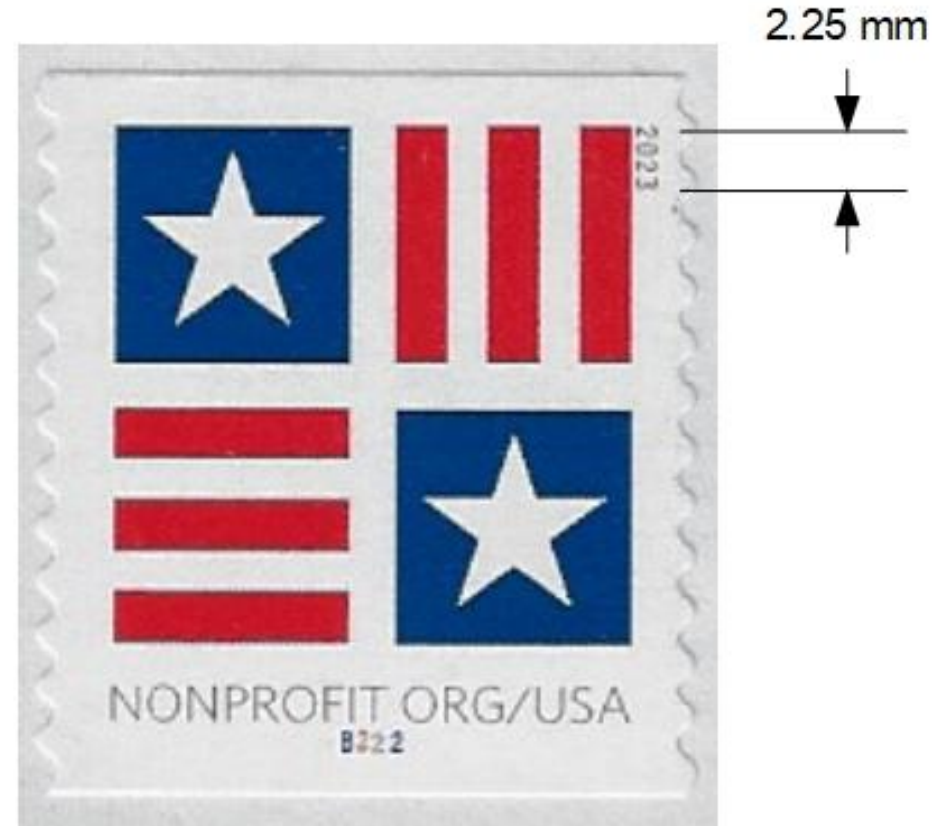

# ALFIE DOG POST

From 1966 to 1973 Herman "Pat" Herst trained his German Sheppard Alfie to pick up mail from local residents and carry to the Postman of Shrub Oak. He would carry the mail from the postman back to the Residence.

The local postage stamp was designed by Robert Shields. 50,000 were issued in sheets of 40 with 5 imperforate pairs on each sheet.



# ISRAEL ANIMATED FLIP BOOK

On November 21 2010, Israel issued a book of 15 stamps celebrating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ASIFA, Association Internationale du Film d' Animation (International Animated Film Association). Flipping through the book shows an animation of a farmer picking a Sabra fruit, peeling it and handing it to his daughter who eats it.

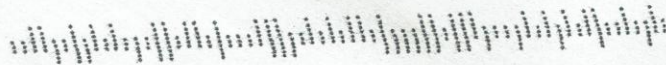

*THE 3¢ WASHINGTON of 1861*

*Only 32 plates were used to print two billion 3 Washingtons of the 1861 Issue. About 20% of these were grilled and only 100,000 were issued in the pink shades.*

*The demand for this new definitive was heightened by the recall of the 1851-57 stamp at the beginning of the War between the States. Mail being sent to and from soldiers serving in the armies also increased demand, and resulted in many interesting patriotic covers.*

*The colors chosen for the new stamp was Pink but the color proved to be unsatisfactory. During 1861 numerous attempt were made to stabilize the color. It was during these late months in 1861 that the Pinks evolved into various shades of Rose. The first recorded cover (August 17, 1861) was a Rose Pink, but all of the Pinks were in postal use from August 1861 to the first month of 1862. Various shades of Rose continued in use until 1864 after which the Browns and Reds begin to appear.*

*The color categories were determined by sorting through several thousand dated covers sequentially. This process produced a pattern of a given shade falling into a specific time period. As was true for the Issue of 1851, colorizing can best be done by keeping dates and shades in tandem in this issue as well.*

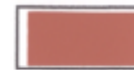

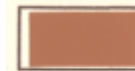
